To conclude the post-conference publication efforts started 3 years ago, the *MDPI Remote Sensing OfS V Special Issue* has now been completed: the final 10th paper was submitted, reviewed and accepted, and it will be added shortly to the other 9 selected papers on the MDPI website (www.mdpi.com/journal/remotesensing/special_issues/N5M29MQT28).

Conversely, the Pillars of Hercules Foundation is still struggling to set up its International Workshop on sea level rise & historical coastal sites, *The Pillars of Hercules: a Mediterranean MOSE*, to be held in Venice (www.oceansfromspacevenice2020.org/wp-content/uploads/2024/04/2024-04-PoHF_Workshop_Proposal.pdf), possibly in 2026.

This newsletter will continue to return every half-year, until the next Symposium is announced. Thanks for your continuing support. We hope to see you again in Venice, in 2030, to celebrate together 50 years of “Oceans from Space”.
